SBTA OPEN COMPETITION - GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

1. CBTF Rules and Regulations (effective Jan. 1, 2020) are in effect and will be strictly enforced. Please check with your coach or Provincial Technical Chairperson if you are unsure of CBTF rules.
2. Judges decisions are final. Tabulation results are considered official after 48 hours.
3. Sponsors reserve the right to divide or combine age divisions as entries warrant. The broadest divisions used are: 7-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15-17, 18+. Athletes as young as 4 yrs of age may participate in pre-competitive events.
4. Classification = Type of event; Division = Age; Status Level = C, BN, BI, BA or A.
LEVEL C: Graded (ages 7-11) A Diamond award will advance a Level C competitor to Level BN.
LEVEL C: (ages 12 & up) A score of 2.5 or greater will advance a Level C competitor to Level BN regardless of placement.
LEVEL BN: Graded (ages 7-11) A Diamond award will advance a BN competitor to Level BI regardless of placement.
LEVEL BN: (ages 12 & up) A score of **3.5** or greater will advance a BN competitor to Level BI regardless of placement.
LEVEL BI: A score of **5.0** or greater will advance a BI competitor to Level BA regardless of placement.
LEVEL BA: A score of **7.0** or greater will advance a BA competitor to Level A regardless of placement.
LEVEL A: one who does not qualify in the above.
5. Any Level BN, BI or BA who enters a Level A Championship classification and competes will automatically become Level A status in that classification regardless of placing.
6. **Change of Status:** Due to advancement at competitions held after the deadline date, proof of advancement date must be received by the entry processor or competition director no later than 48 hours after the competition results in which advancement takes place; otherwise the change will be categorized as late and will not be accepted. The claim must be substantiated by a result tabulation master/score sheet or written official results substantiated/signed by the competition director or lead tabulator.
7. **Payments** - SBTA members payment is made to "your club" and one club payment submitted to the SBTA.

8. **Refunds** will not be given unless a medical certificate is presented.
9. **Awards**
 - o Pre-Competitive Events (individual and group): Ribbons
 - o Graded Events: Levels C, BN (ages 7-11) Solo, 2-baton, 3-baton, Duet (combined ages 14-22), Medley, Solodance Twirl: CBTF graded medals (Bronze, Silver Gold or Diamond).
 - o Individual Competitive events (Medley, Solo, 2 Baton, 3 Baton, Solodance, Duet, Compulsories & Short Program) will be awarded 1st to 3rd place ribbons; 4th and 5th placements will be recognized in categories with 10(+) competitors.
 - o Competitive groups and team are awarded 1st-3rd placement ribbons within their respective divisions.
10. Score paddles will be flashed for all competitive individual and duet events.
11. **Penalties** Drop penalties are assessed in all competitive events. When score paddles are used, the scores do not include the drop penalties. Final scores after penalties are calculated and verified by tabulation on the athlete's score sheets.
12. **Duet Twirl** - Age Divisions (combined ages of both athletes) - Status Level: two athletes who have not competed in Duet together before must start in Level C; otherwise status is determined by CBTF Duet Status from previous results.
13. **SBTA/CBTF Membership** - Each athlete and their coach(es) must be a 2018/2019 member of their own provincial organization to compete in a CBTF sanctioned event. Athletes must have a valid membership number prior to entering.

14. Recording Devices: Contact Competition Director prior to competition date to discuss recording fees and designated locations.
15. All athletes will receive score sheets or critique sheets for individual and duet events. Clubs will receive score sheets and Judges masters for group events. Competition results recap are released from tabulation within 48 hours of competition end.
16. **Medical Apparel/apparatus:** Athletes wearing tensor bandages, etc. at a competition may be asked to provide a medical certificate PRIOR TO COMPETING stating that the athlete can participate in the competition event. The Competition Director (in consulting with the Head Judge) has the authority to refuse to allow an athlete to compete if a medical certificate is not provided.
17. **ERRORS OR OMISSIONS** on entry forms will be corrected by email to the club's registrar.
18. **CBTF (Canadian Baton Twirling Federation) RISK MANAGEMENT POLICY**
 1. The Competition Director or Designate will have the authority to immediately stop the competition whenever a risk factor related to safety becomes evident.
 2. If this situation occurs during individual competition, the competition on the lane where the situation occurs will be stopped on the lane only.
 3. If an athlete has to leave the competition to seek outside medical assistance because of a situation that has occurred during a competition, they will require a medical certificate in order to continue competing.
